RECIPE

Herefordshire Apple Cake

85g (3oz) butter, 175g (6oz) castor sugar, 1 orange rind grated, 225g (8ozs) self raising flour, 450g (1lb) Bramley apples, peeled cored and cubed, 2 eggs beaten, 2 tbsp cider, 28g (1oz) of candied peel, chopped, about 1 tbsp of granulated sugar.

Method: Grease and flour a 23cm (9”) round cake tin. Cream butter, sugar and orange rind, and beat until light and creamy. Mix 1 tbsp of the flour with apples in a dish. Put eggs and cider in bowl with creamed butter. Add remaining flour, peel and apples to the creamed mixture and blend well with a metal spoon. Turn into prepared tin, sprinkle with granulated sugar. Bake in a moderate oven, gas mark 4 or 180°C / 350°F, for 40 to 50 minutes until golden brown.

Moist Coconut and Carrot Cake

350g (12oz) wholemeal self raising flour, 2 level teaspoons cinnamon, 225g (8oz) soft light brown sugar, 350g (12 oz) carrots peeled and coarsely grated, 50g (2oz) desiccated coconut, 7fl oz or 11 tablespoons oil, 5 tablespoons milk, 3 eggs size 3 beaten, 8” loose bottomed cake tin. Mix together flour, cinnamon, sugar, carrot and coconut, stir in oil, milk, eggs and mix well. Bake 1.1/2 hours gas mark 4 or 350°F/180°C.

Recipe:

Rhubarb Mint Jelly

Wipe and cut up some rhubarb. Add a little water and cook until it is reduced to a pulp. To each pint of juice, allow 450g (1lb) of sugar and return to pan.

Take a bunch of fresh mint, tie together and add to contents of pan. Boil until jelly thickens, removing mint when jelly is flavoured to taste.

Pour into small pots and tie down. This is delicious alternative to mint sauce with lamb.
