**THEME:**

**Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!**

***Rules:***

1. All entry forms to reach the Produce and Handicraft steward no later than 6pm on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
2. Entries to be staged between 8:00am and 9.45am on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022 **and must not be removed until 5.00pm on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022.**
3. Please go to the main entrance (Box Office) where you will be directed to the Produce and Handicrafts marquee.  
**Please note: Car parking will be at the main car park.  
No person shall be allowed in the tent during judging other than the stewards.**
4. Entry fee **30p** for each adult class entry and the children's classes are **free**.
5. Entry fees **must** be paid at the time of entry.  
A competitor may make any number of entries in any one class (except Art and Photography) but shall be eligible for only one prize in any one class.
6. The decision of the Judge is final. They can withhold or diminish any prize or give an additional prize where they consider an entry deserves it.
7. Floral Art will be judged under NAFAS rules.
8. The Committee will exercise all reasonable care but will not be responsible for any loss or damage of goods or personal injury whatsoever.
9. All exhibits will be left at owners risk.
10. **THE PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY is held in the Handicrafts Marquee at 4.45pm on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022.**
11. Exhibitors can enter the gala show ground for the ceremony and to collect exhibits after 4:00pm on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
12. All exhibits must be collected after the Prize Giving Ceremony. The committee cannot hold or deliver exhibits once the show is finished.
13. Prize money uncollected by the end of Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022 will be returned in the gala funds.

1. Pineapple upside-down cake (**recipe given below**)

**Edible items to be covered. Please cover with a clear plastic bag not cling film. Competitor's number should be on the plate not the bag.**

### **RECIPE FOR A PINEAPPLE UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE**

**Cooking time: 40mins**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

**CAKE:** 100g softened butter, 100g golden caster sugar, 100g self-raising flour, 1 tsp baking powder, 1 tsp vanilla extract, 2 eggs

**TOPPING:** 50g softened butter, 50g light soft brown sugar, 7 pineapples rings in syrup drained and syrup reserved, 7 glacé cherries

#### **METHOD:**

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4.

For the topping, beat 50g softened butter and 50g light soft brown sugar together until creamy.

Spread over the base and a quarter of the way up the sides of a 20cm round cake tin. Arrange 7 pineapple rings on top (reserving the syrup for later), then place 7 glacé cherries in the centres of the rings.

Place 100g softened butter, 100g golden caster sugar, 100g self-raising flour, 1 tsp baking powder, 1 tsp vanilla extract and 2 eggs in a bowl along with 2 tbsp of the reserved pineapple syrup. Using an electric whisk, beat to a soft consistency.

Spoon into the tin on top of the pineapple and smooth it out so it's level. Bake for 35mins. Leave to stand for 5mins, then turn out onto a plate.

In line with the Produce and Handicrafts theme of "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle", one of the sections in each class will be about using recycled items. We will also be looking for originality in all classes.

### **ADULT CLASS**

37. Second time around - No larger than 30cmx30cm. e.g. collage using recycled materials, with or without added paint
38. Our World on the brink - Your interpretation
39. People of our planet - Portrait or group

### **JUNIOR CLASS (10 to 12YRS)**

40. Creative reusing - No larger than 30cmx30cm. Picture created with recycled materials.
41. Our planet, the way forward - Your interpretation.

### **JUNIOR CLASS (7 to 9YRS)**

Age (on back of work) will be taken into account.

42. Creative reusing - No larger than 30cmx30cm. Picture created with recycled materials.
43. Our planet, the way forward - Your interpretation.

### **ARTWORK MUST BE SUBMITTED FRAMED AND READY TO HANG.**

The maximum size of artworks (apart from recycled pictures) should be A2 420mm x 594mm including frame.

The art entries must not have been exhibited in previous years.

Competitors limited to 3 entries per class.

Under 16yrs entries are **FREE**

**70. PRE-SCHOOL CLASS**

Use a handprint and turn it into a different creature (no larger than A4).

**71. RECEPTION CLASS: 4 - 5 YEARS**

Use junk modelling to create a worm or other animal which is great for making compost.

**72. YEAR 1: 5 - 6 YEARS**

Using crayons, pencils or pastels, draw a detailed picture of a leaf and label it with its name.

**73. YEAR 2: 6 - 7 YEARS**

Choose one of these words: reduce, reuse, recycle and write it in capitals, illustrating it with what the word means (any medium - pencil, collage, paint - can be used but no larger than A4).

**74. YEAR 3: 7 - 8 YEARS**

Using collage materials (old magazines/newspapers for example) create an image of the world from space (no larger than 30cm by 30cm).

**75. YEAR 4: 8 - 9 YEARS**

Choose one of these words: reduce, reuse, recycle and write it in an acrostic style poem telling the reader what impact on the world this action will have (this must be handwritten and no larger than A4).

**76. YEAR 5: 9 - 10 YEARS**

Using a computer program/app design an eye-catching poster encouraging people to reduce, reuse, recycle - no larger than A4. The design should include a slogan, message and/or further information as well as incorporating a photo taken or image drawn by the child.

**77. YEAR 6: 10 - 11 YEARS**

Write a persuasive text to encourage a famous person to reduce, reuse, recycle. Link what the person does with some advice and suggestions to help save the planet (this can be handwritten or typed but no longer than an A4 page).
